

Don't forget to bring your receipts from any League City establishment at which you shop or eat the day of a **BABA** show. Your shopping in League City helps promote **BABA**. 

Various I Ain't Gonna Work Tomorrow Songs of the Carter Family KG-0544

Playing Time: 32:04

The legendary Carter family, having done as much to shape bluegrass and acoustic music as any other group that comes to mind, passed from the recording scene in 1941. Their music, however, lives on and shows very little loss of popularity. This album features twelve of the Carter's many hits done by some of the most popular bluegrass artists in their day - most have also passed from the scene although a few are still around making music today.

One group, The Lewis Family, still touring and recording today, do a great version of "Picture on the Wall" with Pop Lewis on the lead vocal. The Stanley Brothers classic sound brings the old standard "Bury Me Under The Weeping Willow" to life. Another highlight on this project is Hylo Brown's version of the old tune "Lulu Wall," the Carters recorded back in 1929. Hylo's version includes some nice but simple lead work on what sounds like an autoharp. Wilma Lee and Stoney Cooper are also featured on this project singing the Carter's signature song and perhaps one they will most be remembered for "Wildwood Flower." I also like the Country Gentlemen's version of the old classic "I Never Will Marry" with vocals by the great Charlie Waller.

Although many tributes to the Carter's music have been done over the years lots of fans (like me) just can't get enough of this great music. *I Ain't Gonna Work Tomorrow* is a fitting tribute to this family, truly an icon in early acoustic country music. The CD presents more timeless songs with interesting, illuminating and concise liner notes that detail a short history of each song, capping a great album most bluegrass fans will enjoy.
