

Anne's Notes

1964

In May I attended my high school reunion. Memorial High School in the Spring Branch ISD. Our 50th. The 3-day event was spectacular: Friday night burgers and shakes at Prince's Hamburgers, Saturday picnic and tour of the school, Saturday night gala at the Houston Racquet Club, and Sunday morning tour of the city of Houston, noting the many changes that have taken place. I made a presentation for the Saturday night bash, featuring three or four news headlines from each year. Somehow (squirrel!) I started wondering just where bluegrass was in 1964, the year I graduated from high school. (Side note: if you're doing the math, I started school year earlier than most kids, so take one of those years away for my age.)

We watched a variety show called Hootenanny, which presented mostly folk music, but with plenty of country and bluegrass mixed in. The show was actually viewed as controversial for the political views expressed by some of its guests. Pete Seeger was among those blacklisted by the show's producers, but then he went on hat year for an amazing tour of – wait for it – Czechoslovakia!

Carter and Ralph Stanley formed their band, the Stanley Brothers and the Clinch Mountain Boys, in 1946 as the first band to copy the Monroe sound, and they were actively performing and releasing records in 1964. Bill Monroe and whichever of his Bluegrass Boys were playing with him at the time (depending on what month and/or day it was) released "I'll Meet You in Church on Sunday Morning" on January 1, 1964. The Dillards (a.k.a., The Darlings) could be seen from time to time on The Andy Griffith Show. Here they are with "Dooley" https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Pd_WJIrxApI

Still going strong, Flatt & Scruggs released "My Saro Jane" and "You Are My Flower" in 1964.

Meanwhile, we loved listening to "The Ballad of Jed Clampett" each week on The Beverly Hillbillies.

On March 2, 1964, Jim & Jesse (McReynolds) were invited to join the Grand Ole Opry after making several appearances as guest performers If you're not familiar with the boys, "Jesse played the mandolin with a unique, self-invented 'crosspicking' and 'split-string' playing method, and Jim sang as a high tenor and played guitar." *

"The Classic" line-up of the Country Gentlemen from 1960–64, consisted of the group's co-founders Charlie Waller on guitar and John Duffey on mandolin, with Eddie Adcock on banjo and Tom Gray on Bass.* BABA has had the pleasure of hosting Eddie & Martha Adcock several times over the past few years.
